





Numerous forest fires in the west may delay any pending drop in lumber prices, as video of RSG's log deck ablaze at their Molalla, OR mill drew more concern around lumber shortages. Futures appear to show the money is leaning toward lower prices in November. OSB and plywood remain high and tight for the time being.
