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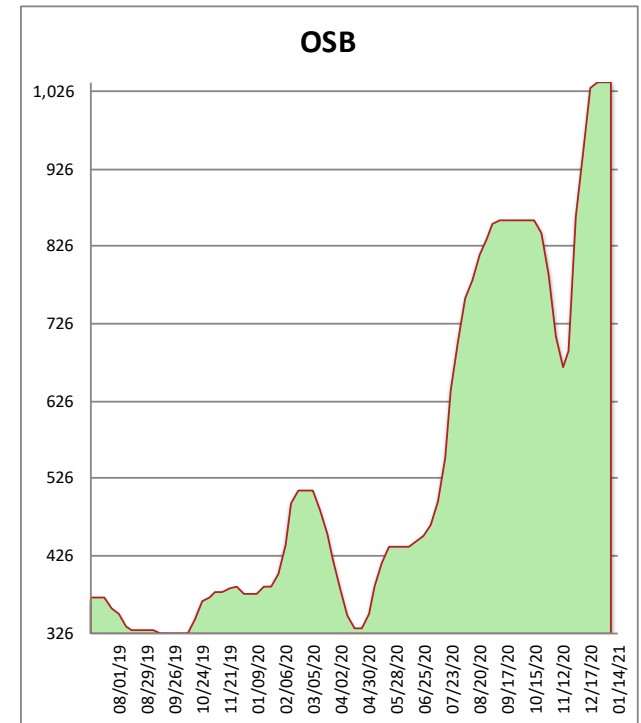
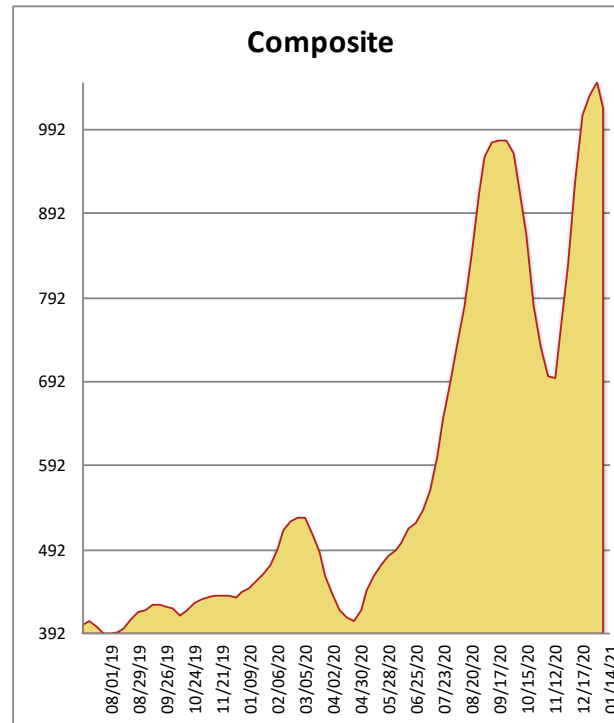

Inventory levels at distribution are still wimpy and nothing to hang your hat on. No matter the case, we are still in an under supplied market and any adjustments may be relatively short lived.
