

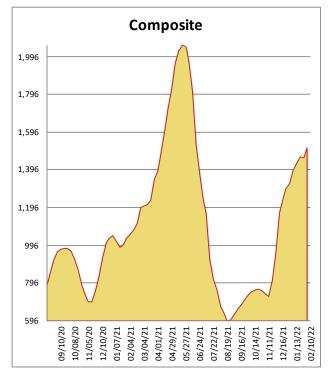
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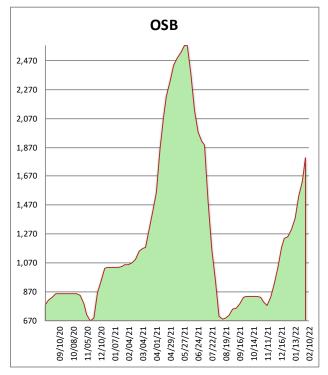

Widespread transporttation issues, tight supply, and now a seven day up limit rally in lumber futures has prices firming up across the board. DF studs DRY/GRN found a bottom late last week and prices pushed up 50 - 100 higher. Plate stock was right on its heels. SYP prices pushed higher with scant offerings and limited availability, especially in 2x6 and 2x12. SPF prices shot upwards with many mills off the market or quoting very little. OSB remains very difficult to source as pricing continues upward. Plywood has been a great alternative but is starting to push higher. Freedom Convoys at the border continue to hamper the flow of goods, including lumber across the border. This combined with a vast shortage of cars has continued to push supply/demand completely in the mills favor.
