


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

Sales of SYP have cooled as buyers have ample inventory for now. Wides were the exception. SPF continues to be soft, more so in the west. Green DF has been hot but appears to be stalling a bit. Reports of rail delays in the west have buyers watching closely. Studs were mixed, In the panel world, plywood was a mixed bag. SYP remains on more solid footing than does Western Fir. OSB seems to be tracking with the weather - better in the drier regions and struggling where the moisture is still prevalent. Enjoy your Easter weekend - nothing like the Masters on Easter Sunday.
