



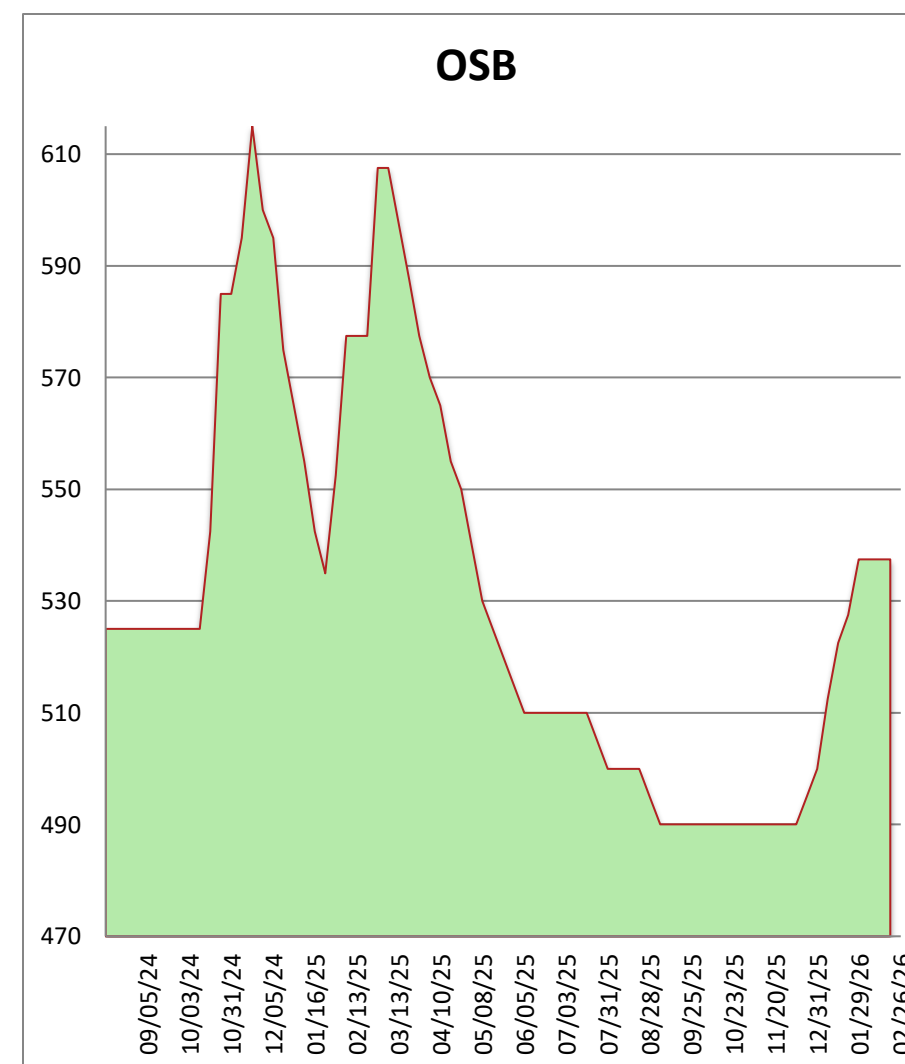
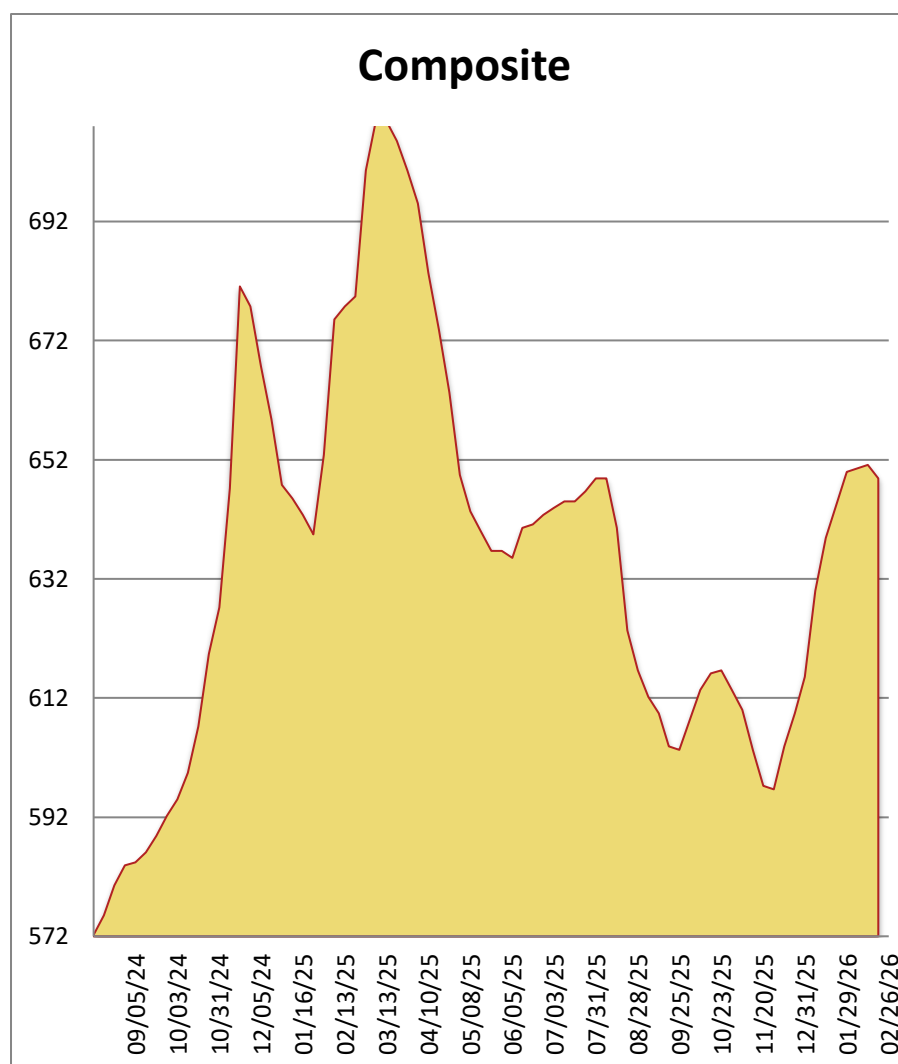

Many buyers have taken a more patient approach, covering primarily immediate needs. SYP dimension remains under the most pressure as supply now aligns more comfortably with demand, particularly in narrower widths, while wider material has held up somewhat better. Green DF moved lower as availability improved, Dry DF and SPF also softened, though less noticeably. Stud activity was generally quiet, trending in line with overall market tone. Panels continue to show relative stability. SYP plywood edged higher; Western plywood saw slight gains, and OSB was mostly steady across regions. Inventories appear balanced, and without a significant shift in demand, that steadiness may continue. And on a brighter note - Congrats to the U.S. Men's Hockey Team for bringing home the Gold. Always good to see a team peak at the right time.
