



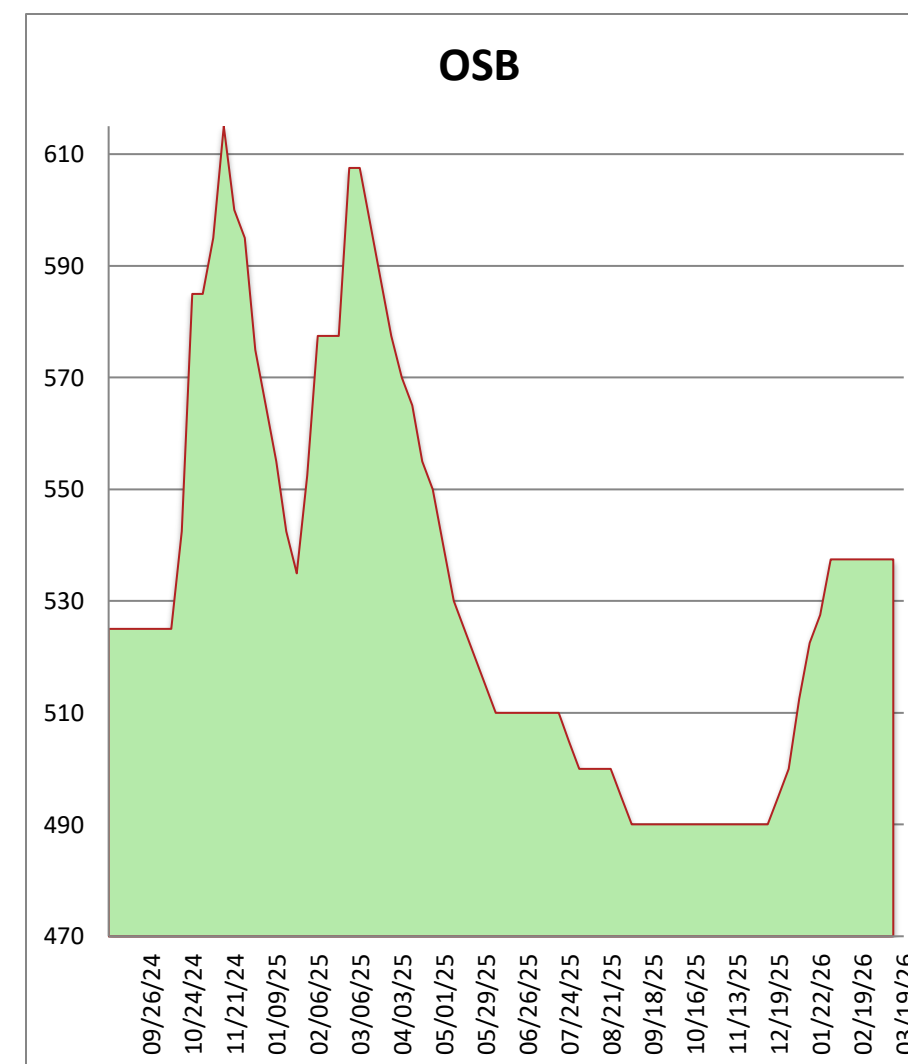
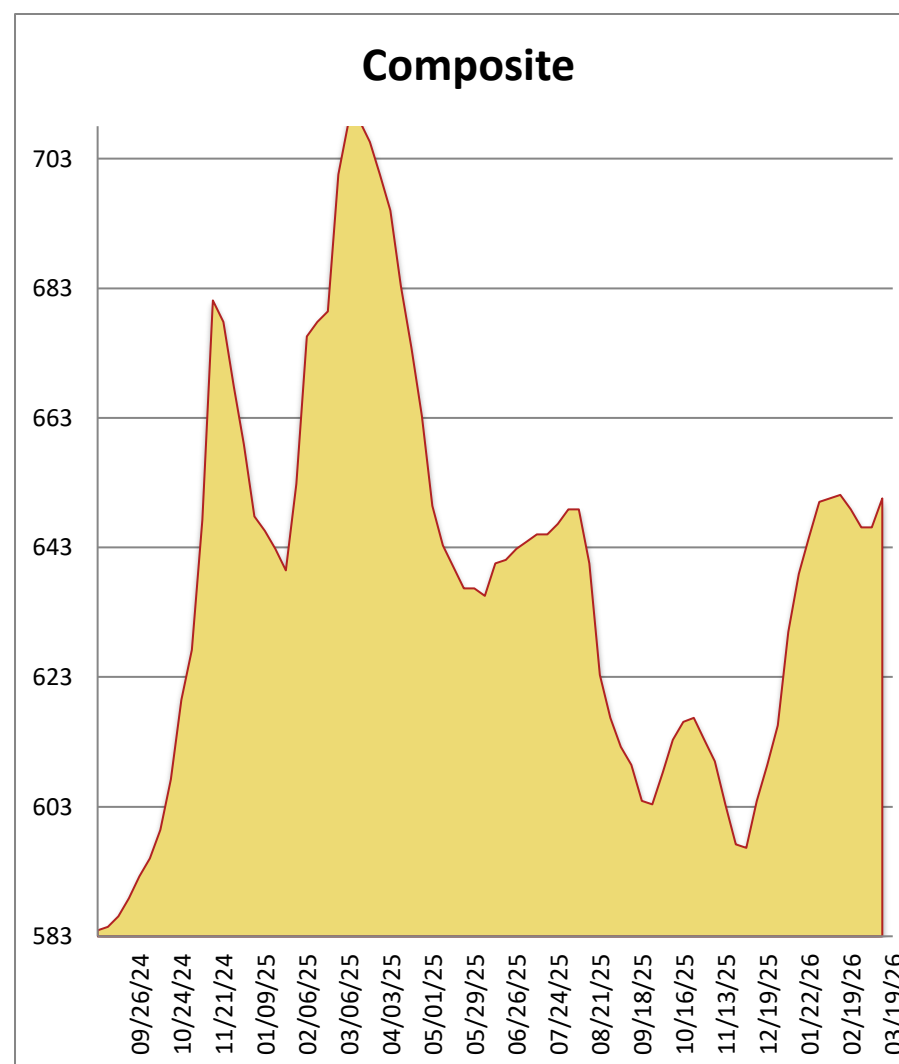

The trends of prior weeks remain in place in both dimension lumber and panels as we roll quickly into spring. Once again, SYP dimension is leading the way with double digit price appreciation. Sales were certainly not hot this week, but the feeling of overall supply tightening, coupled with unseasonably warm weather and very tight availability on trucking has kept mills with the upper hand. The same can be said for SYP plywood. The continued increase in fuel prices is adding to the uptick. Green DF narrows continued to show upward momentum, and dry DF is firm to up in price. Dry studs, which looked to be toppy just a couple of weeks ago, now look to have turned the corner and are rising as well. OSB remains largely lackluster, with secondaries able to spin weekly contracts and mills holding steady. Fir plywood remains flat like OSB. Good Luck in your MM brackets!
