



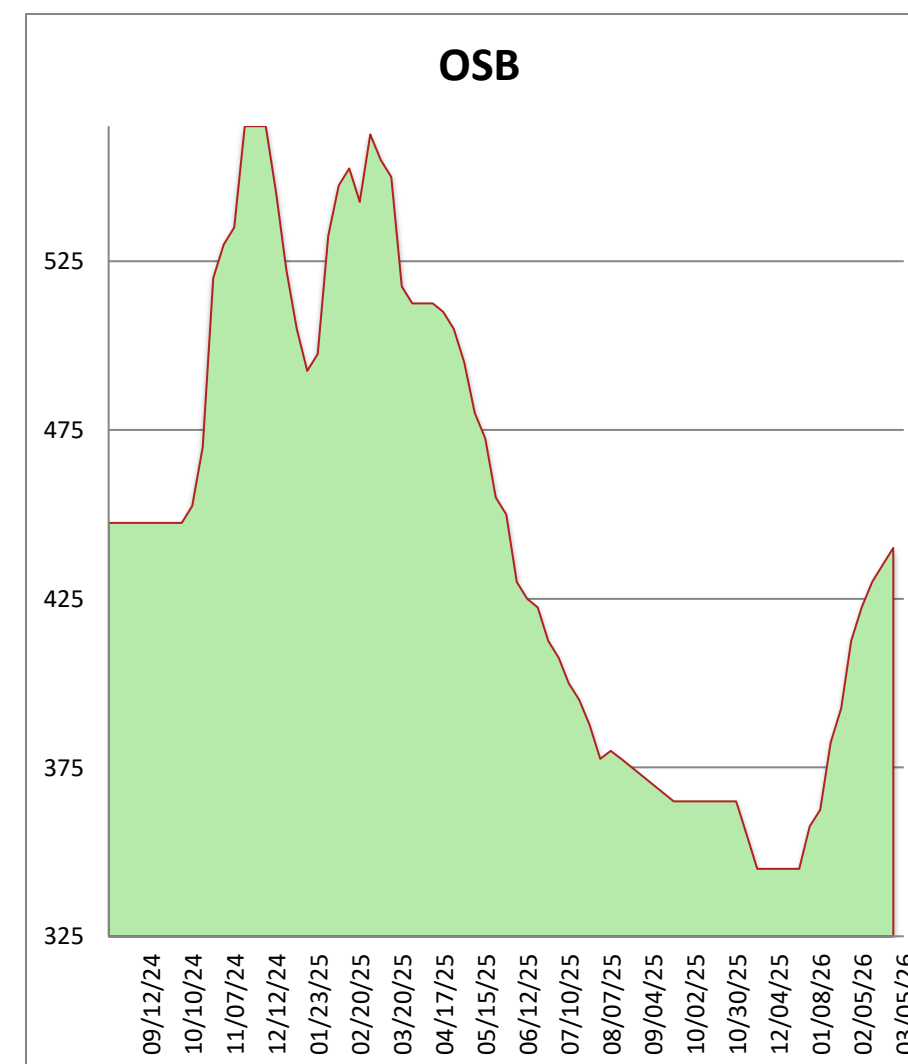
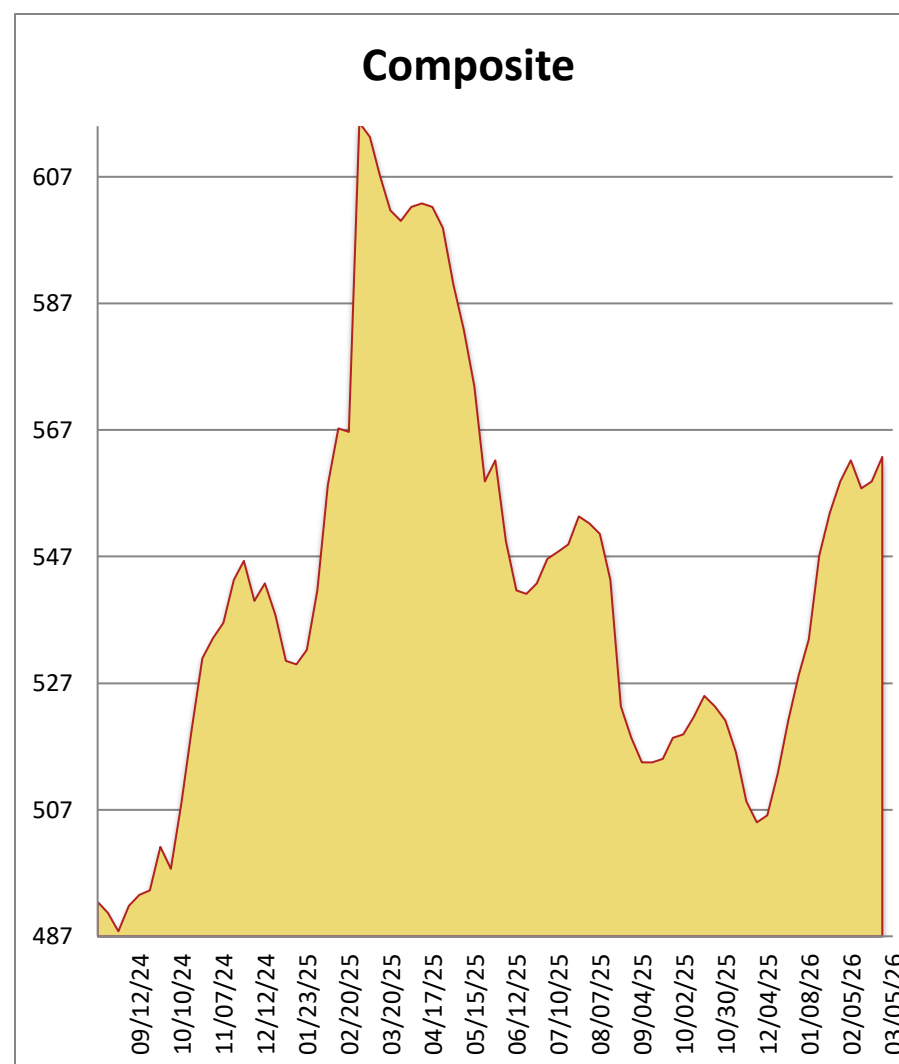

Lumber markets heated up this week as activity kicked in across many regions. Look for prices to climb in the coming weeks as both the cash market and futures get more activity. What looked like a possible downward correction just a few weeks ago has definitely made a U-turn. Panels are not as active, though SYP plywood continues its consistent upward climb. Trucking issues across southern markets have made it difficult to book trucks in some cases, and those costs are also ticking up. As we approach daylight savings, it is beginning to feel like the longer work days will pull from supply and we could see more items bumping up. It may not be a bad time to lock for 2026 jobs.
