



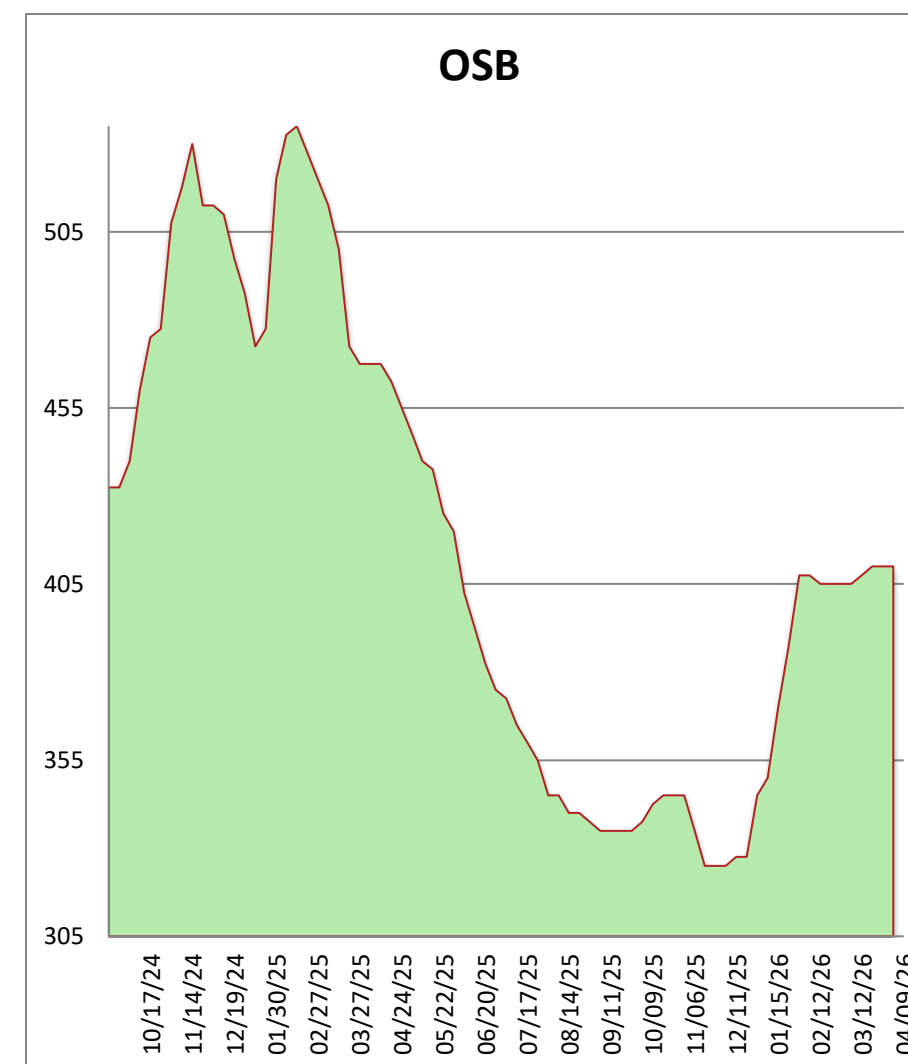
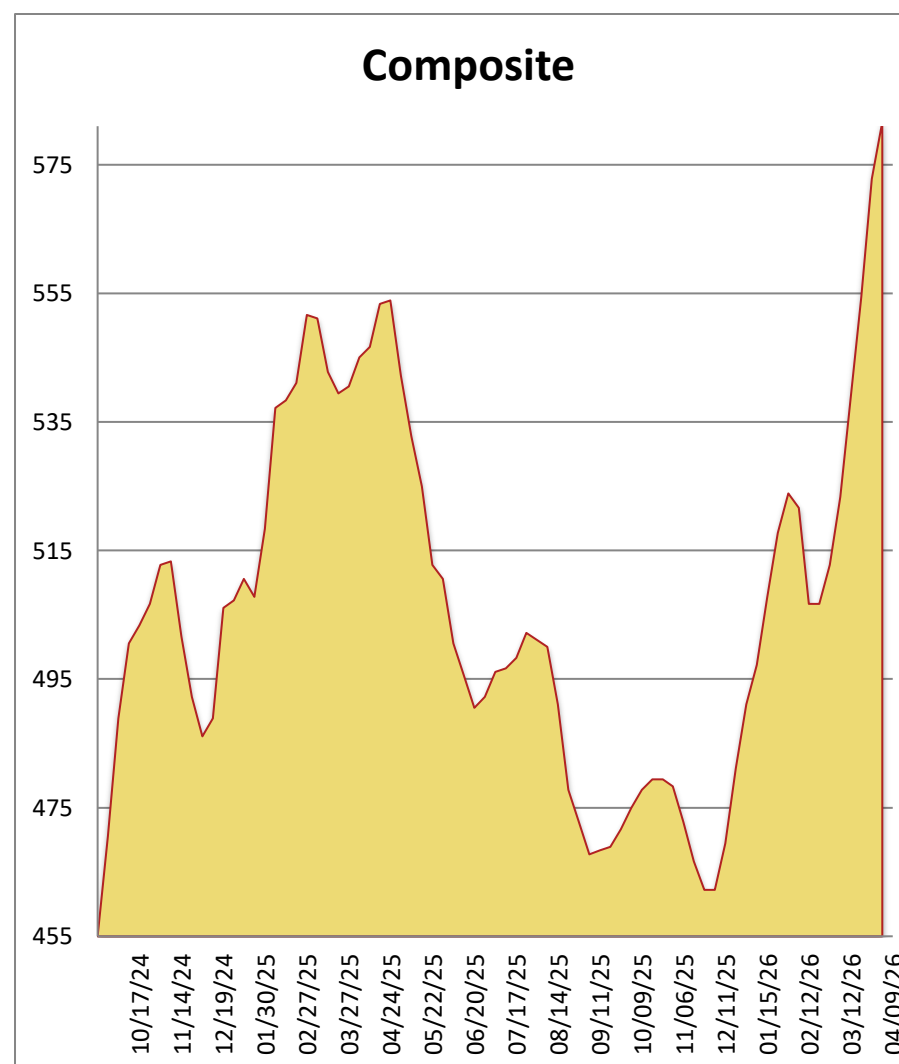

Markets this week continue to show sharp upward momentum across most major framing categories. SYP lumber remains the clear leader, with both narrows and wide's pushing higher as transportation constraints and elevated fuel costs keep mills in control. Dry DF dimension and studs remain firm, with steady demand supporting gains. GRN DF has continued to push higher with double digit gains on both narrows and studs with 2x6 the clear leader. Fir plywood is also showing strength, following the pine sheathing run-up over the past month. OSB remains subdued, though some regions are seeing sporadic buying interest. Overall, it's a painful market for anyone not covered. Speaking of pain, how about Tiger watching from the sidelines this weekend instead of attempting to run it back as the boys take on 90th edition of The Masters.
